EVENT SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

PART 1

Art. 1 ANNOUNCEMENTS

1. All the qualifying events of the "Marlboro/Autosport National Rally Championship" are designated by Permit as Special Stage Races of national status.
2. The name and address of the promoters is announced in Part 1 of these Supplementary Regulations.

Art. 2 JURISDICTION

1. The events will be held under:
 - a) The General Regulations of the RAC Motor Sports Association Ltd (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA)
 - b) The Championship Regulations of the "Marlboro/Autosport National Rally Championship"
 - c) These Regulations
 - d) Part 1 of these Supplementary Regulations and any written instructions from the Promoting Club may issue for the event.

Art. 3 AUTHORISATION

1. Details of the RACMSA Permit Number and DOE Authorisation Number (as appropriate) are published in Part 1 of the Supplementary Regulations or the Final Instructions.
2. The "Marlboro/Autosport National Rally Championship" and its associated one make Series Permit Number is CH5229.
3. The event will comply with the Motor Vehicles (Competition & Trials) Regulations where they are applicable.
4. Map numbers required by competitors are listed in Part 1 of these Supplementary Regulations.

Art. 4 ELIGIBILITY

1. The event is open to competitors (whether Entrant, Driver or Co-driver) holding valid Licences and Permits issued by the RAC Motor Sports Association Ltd, or the Royal Irish Automobile Club.
2. Competitors are reminded of the RACMSA's requirements for Entrant Licences and Advertising Permits as laid down on the Licence declaration form.
3. All competitors Licences and Permits will be inspected at signing on together with the Championship Registration papers.
4. Part 1 of these Supplementary Regulations shall detail such other conditions of eligibility and conditions as applicable to the event.

Art. 5 CLASSES

1. Each qualifying event shall contain the eight Championship Classes as follows as a minimum. (Part 1 of these Supplementary Regulations contains details of other class structures — as applicable):
 - Class 1 - N1 — 1957 Gp. N cars — up to and including 1600cc
 - Class 2 - N2 — 1957 Gp. N cars — over 1600cc
 - Class 3 - A1 — 1957 Gp. A cars — up to and including 1300cc
 - Class 4 - A2 — 1957 Gp. A cars — over 1300cc and up to and including 1600cc
 - Class 5 - A3 — 1957 Gp. A cars — over 1600cc and up to and including 2000cc
 - Class 6 - A4 — 1957 Gp. A cars — over 2000cc
 - Class 7 - B1 — cars complying with 1987 RACMSA Vehicle Regulations — up to and including 1600cc
 - Class 8 - B2 — cars complying with 1987 RACMSA Vehicle Regulations — over 1600cc
2. Cars with forced induction will have their capacity increased by 20%.
3. Should any class have less than 5 entries, the organisers reserve the right to amalgamate those cars with another class or reduce the awards if as deemed appropriate.
4. All cars must comply with the 1987 RACMSA Technical Regulations GA, GH and GJ and where appropriate to the class the International Appendix 'J' Regulations (see also Art. 10).
5. No stunts or stunts are permitted.
6. All cars must be taxed and insured for the Public Highway.

Art. 6 IDENTIFICATION

1. Competitors will be required to make available both front doors for the exclusive use of the organisers for the purpose of carrying the event identification which will include advertising for the event and the Championship. Such identification must be set above the competition numbers.
2. Competitors will be issued with entry plates to be fixed to the front and rear of the car and side plates to be fixed ABOVE the competition numbers. In addition, competitors must display registration and black numbers on a white background on both sides of the car. Competitors are reminded that these numbers must be removed or covered completely after the event or upon retirement.

Art. 7 ENTRIES

1. Should the number of entries (either overall or in each class) not reach the minimum stated then the organisers have the right to either cancel the meeting or amalgamate the classes where necessary.
2. Each entry fee shall include one service pack per competing car.
3. Final instructions shall contain details of the competition, starting numbers and they will be posted to Entrants at least 7 days before the event.
4. Where it is applicable the entry fee has been based on the current Forestry Commission road charges. Should there be any variation in these charges it may be necessary to levy an additional entry supplement, which will be collected at signing on, although it will be advised to competitors in advance (1.1.7.6).

5. Entrants are required to indicate on their Entry Form their eligibility for the various Awards and Championships.
6. The order of starting will be at the organiser's discretion, but to assist seeding entrants should state their previous results on the Entry Form.
7. Once the Entry List has been published no communication will be entered into regarding it.
8. Part 1 of these Supplementary Regulations details all other information concerning entry and entries together with the maximum and minimum number of entries overall and in class.

Art. 8 RESULTS

1. Provisional results will be published within 2 hours of the finish of the event. Protests must be made in accordance with N.1.2. Final results sheets will be available to all competitors at the finish of the event.

Art. 9 ROUTE ROAD BOOK DOCUMENTATION

1. Basic details of the route will be contained in Part 1 of these Supplementary Regulations.
2. The event will contain several Special Stages on private property owned by Public Highway sections. Special Stages will be timed to an accuracy of less than one minute by Marshall, under the supervision of an RACMSA appointed timekeeper. Cars will start at one minute intervals. The route will be defined by a figure grid references and by a Full Road Book.
3. Full details of the route and Special Stages will be issued to competitors when they sign on. These documents will contain all the necessary information to enable the competitor to comply with 4.5.8 and 4.3.1.

* Art. 10 SCRUTINEERING AND SIGNING-ON *

1. Exact details will be given in the Final Instructions. All scrutineering cars will be examined for compliance with the 1987 tax and vehicle regulations as well as for class eligibility. Each entrant will be assumed to have full knowledge of the conditions of eligibility for the class entered.
 2. Homologation Forms valid for 1987 international rallies must be provided and made available at any event scrutineering, and on demand throughout the event for all Group N or A cars. Forms to provide the Forms will be sent to each class location or location.
 3. Unless the RACMSA Specification Approval Papers or Homologation Papers for particular cars are provided and made available at any event scrutineering and on demand throughout the event, other cars running in the event shall be entered as follows:
 - Normally Applied engines with more than 2 valves per cylinder and over 2.6 litres shall have their max. Air Restrictor at 32mm.
 - Forced induction engines over 1.6 litres shall have an Air Restrictor at 32mm limited.
 4. All cars must be fitted with a substantial Roll-Over Protection.
 5. All cars shall have substantial underbody protection covering any area of a fuel tank exposed to running damage.
 6. All cars shall have an Arm fitted so as they may be activated by the Co-Driver.
 7. Cars shall have the extinguishing systems using either BCF or SFM extinguishant as follows:
 - Classes 1-6 Inclusive — As FSA requirement.
 - Classes 7-8
- Normally Applied Engines
- 5kg capacity discharging into both cockpit and engine compartment.
- Forced induction engines
- 5kg unit 2.5kg capacity for discharge into engine and Cockpit compartments respectively.
 - The 5kg unit to be plumbed in and the 2.5kg unit to be at the disposal of the Co-Driver for hand use.
 - The 5kg unit should have two points of triggering one for the driver and Co-Driver and one outside the car for activation by Marshall etc.
 - The triggering point from the exterior must be positioned close to the Circuit Breaker (or combined with it) and must be marked by the letter "E" in red inside a white circle of at least 100mm diameter with a red edge.
 - In installing units the direction of nozzles should be carefully considered, Induction, Exhaust, Ignition and Fuel pumping systems being the most likely areas for fire to occur.
 - The units should work in any position, even if inverted.
8. Cars shall have fitted, and the Driver and Co-Driver shall use, seat belts in conformity with GJ 20.5.
 9. Crash Helmets will be examined in conformity with current regulations.
 10. Red Cross/OK Boards must be available for inspection at scrutineering.

Art. 11 DAMAGE DECLARATION

1. Competitor will be required to complete and sign a report declaring that they have not been involved in any incident resulting in damage to private property or injury to persons or animals or alternatively giving details of any such incident where damage or injury has occurred. Any information given will not incur a penalty but failure to hand in a duly completed form will be penalised by expulsion.
2. Competitors who do not report of the finish are required to forward the report to the Secretary within 48 hours of the event, unless they have been involved in an incident in which case details must be given to the organisers the same day. Competitors who fail to comply will be penalised in accordance with 1.4.13.5.5 and may be reported to the RACMSA for further disciplinary action.

* Art. 12 JUDGES OF FACT-DRIVING STANDARDS OBSERVERS *

1. Named Judges of Fact appointed by the organisers will be on duty throughout the rally to observe and report upon any competitor considered to be in contravention of the Regulations under 1.4.5.1.
2. The Chief Scrutineer and Eligible Scrutineer appointed for the event are Judges of Fact in respect of Vehicle Eligibility.
3. The Stint Official on all Special Stages will be empowered to Judge whether or not a competitor has made a false start.
4. The organisers may appoint Driving Standards Observers in accordance with 1.2.

Art. 13 CONTROLS AND TIMING

- Crews must present themselves with their cars at all controls.
- All clocks will be set to BBC time.
- Special stage timing will be by digital clocks, operated by Marshals under the control of the RAC MSA Timekeeper. All stages will have a bogey time indicated in the Road Book.
- Timing will be to the previous whole second.
- Competitors are reminded that they must be ready to start a Special Stage when required to do so by the Start Marshal.
- Control and Stage signs will be as per RAC MSA Regulations.
- It is a competitor's responsibility to ensure that his times are correctly recorded and handed in when and where instructed.
- The Rally will be divided into Road Sections and Special Stages.
- All controls other than Passage Controls (PC's) and Route Checks will be Time Controls (TC's). Each road section will be clocked a target time based on an approximate 26 mph average or less and a competitor can calculate his Due Time of arrival at any TC by adding this Target Time to his actual time of departure from the preceding TC. On Road Sections following a Special Stage three or four minutes extra may be included over the set average speed to account for any delays at the Special Stage Finish.
- All Special Stages will have a Bogey Time set at 65 mph (or 75 mph if run entirely on a tarmac surface) and a Target Time set at approximately 30 mph (or less on short stages). Competitors will receive penalties on Special Stages as follows:

(i) Under Bogey	Bogey Time
(ii) Over Bogey under target	Actual Time Taken
(iii) Over Target	Target Time
	(No extra time penalties)

11. However, lateness taken over Target Time on Road Sections and Special Stages is cumulative and overall cannot be regained. Where a competitor's accumulated lateness calculated from the previous Main Control exceeds the permitted maximum of 30 minutes a competitor will be excluded.

12. Should any recorded time not be legible or not appear authentic the organisers may use any means at their disposal to establish a time.

13. The following shall describe the various types of Time Controls:

(a) Main Control

(i) Main controls will be situated at the Start and Finish of the Rally, immediately before and after any Red Halt, or at any other specified point.
(ii) At an MC after a Red Halt competitors will restart at one minute intervals either in number order, or in order of their arrival at the MC immediately preceding that halt.

(iii) Each competitor will be given a due starting time from any MC and the difference between this time and his actual starting time will be counted towards exclusion for overall lateness. Also a time penalty will be applied.

(iv) Competitors not excluded by reason of having accumulated more than the maximum allowed lateness will restart (subject to 13(a) (ii))

above) from any MC with zero interest, i.e. interest is only accumulated between two adjacent MC's.

(b) Special Stage Arrive Controls

On arrival at SSA a competitor will receive an arrival time only when he is ready to start the stage (helmets and safety belts on etc.) A competitor who is early may wait for his Due Time outside the Control (see L4.10.13). After checking in to the Control he must then proceed immediately to the Start Line.

(c) Special Stage Start Control

At the SSA a competitor will be given a start time for the Stage in hours and minutes (and, if competitors are to start at 30 second intervals, seconds). Once a competitor has clocked in at an SSA the Start Marshal will assume he is ready to start the stage and will issue a time as soon as the start line is clear, whether the competitor is ready to start or not. The Marshal will inform the competitor at 30 seconds to go, 10 seconds to go, 5 seconds to go and a flag ahead of the driver. He will raise the flag at zero, which will be the signal to start.

At each section a time separately the time taken from SSA to SSS is "Dead Time" and delays are automatically allowed for. The area between the beginning of the Control area and the Stage Start are "paid time".

(d) Special Stage Finish Control

At the SFF a competitor will receive his finish time in hours, minutes and seconds. This time in hours and minutes will be his start time for the following Road Section. Any competitor who fails to stop at the "STOP" line must not, under pain of exclusion, reverse to the stop line, but must return on foot.

(e) Service Areas

All Service Areas will have "IN" and "OUT" Time Controls, and a target time will be specified between these controls. The section between SV "IN" and SV "OUT" will be marked as a Road Section.

(f) Passage Controls

At certain points indicated in the Road Book the organiser may establish PC's in order to collect Time Cards from Competitors at for other purposes. There will be no official times recorded at these controls, but a competitor failing to provide the necessary documents at any PC will be deemed not to have visited that control.

Art. 14 PACE NOTES

- Unless the SR's Part II specifically authorise the use of Pace Notes, then the possession of such notes as defined in L4.0.6. (This does not preclude the use of Distance Survey maps of 1:25,000 or scale in addition to the others that are specified in the SR as being necessary in order to complete the route), by a competitor during the course of the rally whether or not they relate to stages being used in the rally are not allowed.
- The only supplementary information which may be shown ON THE MAPS is information given by the organisers of the event (including route details) plus known danger spots as indicated by the organisers.
- The organisers may set up checks at certain controls and a proportion of competitors and competing cars will be searched. The penalty for being found in possession of pace notes or refusing to allow a search for these to be made is exclusion. At these checks the organisers request the

co-operation of all competitors in order to reduce any delay. Also any competitor at his agent observed on private land without permission within the area covered by the maps referred to in the SR's Part II of the publication of these regulations will be excluded. The only exception to this regulation will be persons who live on, or whose employment causes them to travel along a road used on the event.

Art. 15 SERVICING

- Servicing is defined as work being carried out on the car by any person other than the competing crew, or the use of any part or tools not carried in the competing car. There will be service areas of strategic points where work may be carried out by the Service Crew of the competing car, these will only be accessible to competitors and service vehicles bearing official Service Plates.
- Crews may work unassisted on their own cars in "No Service Areas" except (i) within 100 metres of any Control, (ii) between the Special Stage Arrive Control and the Special Stage Start Control and (iii) in any Parc Ferme. The only work permitted in these areas is to carry out the following work unassisted:
 - replace a wheel with a flat tyre for a wheel and tyre carried in the competing car
 - clean lamp glasses, windscreen and windows
- No other areas may be used by service vehicles, which will be expected to follow a prescribed route to the Service Areas. All other areas will be "Out of Bounds to Service Crews and Vehicles". If a Service Vehicle is observed in an "Out of Bounds to Service Crews and Vehicles" area, the associated competing car will be excluded.
- Service Crews will be subject to the same regulations as competitors regarding noise, bad driving manners etc. and marshals have been instructed to note any infringement of these rules. Competitors are responsible for ensuring that their service crews understand and comply with this regulation and that at all times the service vehicles bear an official Service Plate showing the competitor's rally number.

Art. 16 PENALTIES

- Competitors will start with zero minutes. Classification for the order of Merit will be referenced to total time lost, the winner being the competitor with the least total time penalty.
- In the event of a tie the winner will be the competitor who has completed the greatest distance from the start with the least Stage Penalty.
- The penalties specified in L4.13.5. are replaced as follows:

(1) For each second taken on a Special Stage (SR Art. 13 - Part (i))	1/60
(2) Making a false start to a Special Stage	1
(3) Taking the incorrect route on a Special Stage	5
(4) For each minute before or after Due Time at a Main Control (Out)	1
(5) For each minute under Target Time on the Road Sections and Service Areas	1
(6) Completing any Road Section in less than three quarters of the Target Time for that Section where the Section is 6 miles or more in length.	5
(7) Non-complying with a requirement of the Road Book or of these Regulations for which no other penalty is specified	5
(8) Non-complying with a reasonable instruction by an official provided warning is given that a penalty will be applied, including L4.13.5(e)	5
(9) Breach of a statutory requirement concerning the driving of a motor vehicle	5
(10) Breach of Vehicle Regulations concerning the use of lights and breaches of the Construction and Use of Lighting of Vehicle Regulations	5
(11) Excessive noise, damaged or ineffective silencing system	5
(12) Breach of L4.8.12 (b) Stage Target Time plus 30 minutes	

*Second offence will be penalised by exclusion by the Stewards of the Meeting.

**Causing a decibel meter reading of greater than 84dBA will be deemed to be excessive noise. This will be measured in accordance with the test specification detailed in the RAC MSA Technical Manual. At the discretion of a Judge of Fact or in other cases, the organisers, at their discretion, may refuse permission to proceed at any time and in any case the penalty for a second offence shall be exclusion.

- The following offences will carry a penalty of EXCLUSION:
 - Not reporting at, or not providing proof of visiting a control or check
 - Servicing contrary to Regulation SR Art. 15
 - Driving in the reverse direction on a Special Stage or reversing to a Stage Start Line
 - Smoking on a Special Stage
 - Failure to wear properly fastened seat belts and crash helmets on a Special Stage
 - Commission of SR Art. 11.2, SR Art. 13.11 or SR Art. 14, and/or L4.1.5, L4.2.4, L4.2.13, L4.7.8, or L4.8.12(a).
 - Misuse of "Red Cross" and "OK" symbols on a Special Stage if it is a competitor's responsibility to supply and have available at all times during an event, a RED CROSS/OK BOARD in accordance with 1987 RAC MSA Regulations.

Art. 17 INSURANCE

- The entrant is required to supply the name and address of his insurers on the Entry Form. At many insurance policies no longer give cover for competition, towing motor sport, subject to an acceptable proposal will give third party and passenger liability cover for the event. Entrants not already enrolled in the scheme and wishing to avail themselves of this offer must apply with the Entry Form for a Proposal Form and should note that this must be returned fully completed to the Secretary of the Meeting not less than 21 days before the event.
- All correspondence regarding this cover must be undertaken with the Club, as the Borealis cannot deal with individual applicants either by letter or telephone.

The event will be based in Telford, Shropshire and Rally Headquarters will be the Telford Road House Hotel, Faragate, Telford, (0274/895092). Scrutineering will take place at Sully's at Telford, Trance Road, Telford, Telford.

Art. 22 ROUTE

The route will be on Ordnance Survey 1:50000 1st series maps number 125, 126, 127 & 128. Total distance will be about 200 miles of which approximately 80 miles will be on special stages. All stages will be on sealed roads, except for one in Telford Town Park (at mixed surfaces - 1.5 miles asphalt/0.5 miles gravel).

NOTE-UNDESIRABLY OBSCURING DECALS OR LETTERING LARGER THAN PERMITTED WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED. N.B. Winners of the General Classification Awards will NOT be eligible for Private Entrance Awards. These Private Entrance Awards will be presented to the highest placed Private Entrants outside the first five crews in the General Classification.

FOREWORD

SAFETY

All warnings of permanent hazards and advanced warning arrows at junctions on special stages will be numbered and this number will correspond with the diagram in the Road Book.

Competitors are requested to note any incidents on special stages with reference to these numbers and report them to the stage finish marshals or to the first available marshal if human life is in danger.

An ambulance and a recovery vehicle are available on all special stages.

Radio communication equipment is sited at all stage starts and finishes as well as points along the route through the forest.

If urgent medical attention is required on a special stage a red cross should be used as instructed. An 'OK' board must be used if you stop on a stage but medical attention is not required.

Misuse of these signals will be reported to the Stewards of the Meeting in accordance with J2.13.5.

A recovery vehicle will pass through each special stage to extricate competitors from immediate difficulties after the stage has been shut by the course closing car.

Stages 2 & 3 will not be cleared until final closure after being reused as stages 8 & 9.

Hazards

Certain Fire-Breaks and other known hazards will be numbered as junctions in the Road Book and arrowed on the stage.

As the hazards due to logs in the forest are changing day by day, the marshals at stage starts will inform competitors of particularly dangerous locations and these will be indicated by exclamation marks on the stages.

Petrol

Garages with petrol available along the route of the Rally have been noted in the Road Book and time has been allowed in the time schedule for competitors to fill up as necessary.

A breakdown of Rally mileages is given in the servicing information.




STAGE ARRIVAL SYSTEM

Positioning of Arrows at JUNCTIONS in conjunction with 'No Entry' Boards.

It should be noted that the gates formed by two arrows is always set immediately before the junction in the approach road and to avoid ambiguity, where necessary, the angle of directional change will be exaggerated. Incorrect roads will have 'No Entry' boards and will be blocked but not necessarily at the junction.



There will always be a continuing arrow not more than 25 yards after every junction on the correct road. Similarly, there will always be a 'No Entry' sign not more than 25 yards after every junction on the incorrect roads.

Service areas should reach service area D via the A670 to Telford and the A670, to Stranmillis then the A670 to the junction of Stranmillis and Stranmillis Avenue. The service area is the car park at the junction with Kestley Avenue.

**CONDUCT AT CONTROL****THE START**

The Procedure at controls will be as generally described in the Regulations and Final Instructions.


